Zac Brown's Camp Southern Ground Begins Development

What are your best summer memories? Most likely, they involve sunshine, fresh air and the great outdoors.

At Coweta-Fayette EMC, we recognize the importance of teaching all children, regardless of ability or socio-economic background, life skills and teamwork in a healthy, natural environment. To that end, we recently awarded Camp Southern Ground in Fayetteville funding through Operation Round Up to help install a deep well as part of their initial site development.

Camp Southern Ground, an all-inclusive nonprofit founded by Grammy Award-winning musician Zac Brown, will serve youth ages 7-17 by providing a diverse summer camp and retreat destination for families of children with special needs. Its mission is "to operate a camp to allow children to overcome academic, social and emotional difficulties so they may reach their full potential by providing them with the opportunity and tools necessary to achieve excellence in all facets of their lives."

Programming at Camp Southern Ground will offer fully-accessible recreational activities in a medically supportive

environment, from arts and crafts, canoeing, fishing, hiking, music and organic gardening to outdoor games, rock climbing, a ropes course, swimming, team building, zip lines, nutrition/wellness counseling and more. The facility is currently in development and hopes to welcome 2,000 campers per year beginning in the summer of 2016.

Operation Round Up: Changing Lives, One Penny at a Time

In addition to service and reliability, commitment to community is a top priority for Coweta-Fayette EMCand we know it's important to our members, too.

One way our cooperative seeks to help others is by participating in Operation Round Up, a program that impacts everyone from young school children to the elderly on fixed incomes. By contributing, it's YOU – our co-op members – who are responsible for changing lives.

Founded in 1993, EMC members have the opportunity to literally "round up" their bill to the next highest dollar. The difference is added to a fund managed by the Coweta-Fayette EMC Trust Board and awarded to various organizations in need. The pennies given individually to the program each month combine with the pennies of thousands of other members, and the results are astounding: to date, EMC consumers and Operation Round Up have contributed more than \$200,000 annually to worthy groups in the area.

Funds from Operation Round Up have most recently helped the Newnan/Coweta Boys & Girls Club, Fragile Kids Foundation, Fayette County Special Olympics, Grantville Police Department, Fayette Samaritans, Southern Crescent Walk to End Alzheimer's, Joseph Sam's School and Coweta's Family Patterns Matter, Inc., to name a few.

Melissa Segars Scholarships for high school seniors and technical scholarships for students attending West Georgia Technical College and Southern Crescent Technical College were awarded, and educators had the opportunity to apply for Bright Ideas grants dedicated to special teaching projects not often available in tightly budgeted school systems.

To encourage more members to participate, Coweta-Fayette EMC will hold two drawings, one for existing participants and one for new. For both, first place will be a \$250 Visa gift card and \$250 donation to a charity of your choice; second place will be a \$150 Visa gift card and \$150 donation to a charity of your choice. 

Nominating Committee for Upcoming Board Elections Announced

Bylaws of Coweta-Fayette Electric Membership Corporation

Article III Directors

3.05 Nominations by Nominating Committee. It shall be the duty of the Board to appoint, not less than forty-five (45) days before the date of the meeting of the members at which board members are to be elected, a committee on nominations consisting of not less than five (5) nor more than eleven (11) members who shall be selected so as to give equitable representation to the geographical areas served by the Cooperative. No member of the Board may serve on such committee. Written notice of the names of the members of the committee and meeting date for the committee shall be provided to the members prior to such meeting. It shall be the duty of the nominating committee to meet not less than forty-five (45) days prior to such meeting and to nominate one or more candidates for each seat on the Board of Directors that is to be filled at such meeting.

3.06 Nominations by Petition. Other nominations for such elections may be made by written petition signed by not less than fifteen (15) members, which shall be submitted to the Secretary of the Cooperative or his/her designee not less than forty-five (45) days prior to such meeting.

3.07 Notice of Nominees. The Secretary shall be responsible for posting at headquarters of the Cooperative the nominees for each seat made by the nominating committee and by petition and shall provide written notice thereof to the members by separate written notice according to the rules and procedures promulgated by the Board of Directors.

The following Nominating Committee was appointed by the Board of Directors at their regular meeting held May 27, 2014. This committee will meet August 5 and prepare a list of nominations that will be posted at the EMC office at least 45 days before the annual meeting on October 11, 2014
